- World Banknote Auctions is a public auction of collectable (world) paper money. By bidding and purchasing in our auctions you agree to the terms & conditions as outlined in this document.
- To bid in our auctions each user has to be registered and over 18 years of age at the time of the auction. To become a registered user we may ask you to provide personal details, such as your name, address and other info that we use to identify you. Credit card verification is part of the registration process. In some instances we may ask you to provide further references.
- Items pictured are the actual items available for sale, unless otherwise mentioned in the item description. Items are guaranteed genuine. World Banknote Auctions offers no guarantee regarding the correctness of information in the item description such as rarity, prior sales figures and population reports. World Banknote Auctions reserves the right to withdraw any item prior to the auction date for any reason and no bidder shall have right to damages as the result of a withdrawn lot.
- The majority of items offered by World Banknote Auctions are graded by third-party grading companies (such as PMG or PCGS). Bidder agrees that grading is subjective and can differ between grader and grading companies. World Banknote Auctions makes no warrantee or representation regarding the grades assigned by third-party grading companies. In the case of items graded by World Banknote Auctions bidder acknowledges that currency grading is subjective. World Banknote Auctions does not warrant the accuracy of such grading or descriptions nor do they form the basis for a bid.
- Bids can be placed prior to the auction ("absentee bid") or during the live auction. In the case of equal bids preference is given to the first bid received at the discretion of World Banknote Auctions. Bidding follows set bidding increments and bids that do not follow bid increments are automatically rounded up to the next full increment. Bids cannot be lowered or deleted after having been placed.
- This auction is subject to a buyer's premium of 20% with a minimum of \$10. This buyer's premium is charged per lot. In addition, each purchase is subject to shipping, which is charged per weekly auction. This shipping fee is \$15 for orders within the United States and \$30 for all orders outside of the United States. Additional fees may be charged for large or overweight shipments. World Banknote Auction reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to select the shipping method and speed. For customs purposes full value will be declared and World Banknote Auctions is not responsible for any additional customs fees or import charges levied to buyer. Insurance is included on all packages with a \$50 deductible. Bidder agrees that in the case of loss or damage any insurance settlement by insurance carrier completely satisfies all obligations of World Banknote Auctions to bidder according to these terms & conditions.
- Payment is due within 7 (seven) days after each auction in order to guarantee quick settlement with our consignors. Payments can be made by credit card, check (subject to hold) or wire transfer. If payment has not been received by the payment due date (as listed on the invoice) World Banknote Auctions reserves the right to charge the card on file for the full invoice amount in order to satisfactorily complete the transaction. If buyer fails to satisfactorily make payment we reserve the right to impose an interest charge of 1.5% (one-and-a-half) until payment has been received in full or the maximum permitted by law, whichever is higher. Buyer also agrees to pay for any reasonable attorney, interest and collection charges incurred by World Banknote Auctions to collect past due invoices. If payment is not received within 7 days World Banknote Auctions reserves the right to cancel the transaction. We also reserve the right to no longer accept bids from bidder until payment for previous purchases has been made in full.
- If payment is returned for any reason (such as a chargeback on a credit card, or a "not sufficient funds" check or transfer), World Banknote

Auctions reserves the right to charge buyer any applicable fees, with a minimum of \$35 per instance.

- Buyer agrees to pay any applicable sales tax unless a valid resale certificate is on file with World Banknote Auctions prior to the auction as required by the delivery address provided by buyer. In most instances, only orders shipped within the State of California are subject to sales tax, which currently is 8.75%.
- All items are sold "as-is". NO LOT MAY BE RETURNED FOR ANY REASON, unless there is a material error in the auction description. In that case, please contact us within 3 (three) days after receiving the item and we will provide you with instructions how to return the item. All returned items must be in the original undamaged and untampered holder. World Banknote Auctions reserves the right to refuse any return request if our instructions are not followed.
- If a dispute arises concerning ownership of a lot that has been bid upon, World Banknote Auctions reserves the right to commence a statutory inter-pleader proceeding at the expense of the Consignor and successful Bidder and any other applicable party, and in such event shall be entitled to its reasonable attorney's fees and costs. World Banknote Auctions reserve the right to postpone any auction for any reason. In such case, no bidder shall have any claim as a result thereof, including incidental or consequential damages.
- If a dispute arises from or relates to this contract or the breach thereof, and if the dispute cannot be settled through direct discussions, the parties agree to endeavor first to settle the dispute by mediation administered by the American Arbitration Association under its Commercial Mediation Procedures before resorting to arbitration. The parties further agree that any unresolved controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this contract, or breach thereof, shall be settled by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. The place of arbitration shall be Sacramento, CA. The arbitration shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Hearings will take place pursuant to the standard procedures of the Commercial Arbitration Rules that contemplate in person hearings. Time is of the essence for any arbitration under this agreement and arbitration hearings shall take place within 90 days of filing and awards rendered within 120 days. Arbitrator(s) shall agree to these limits prior to accepting appointment. The arbitrators will have no authority to award punitive or other damages not measured by the prevailing party's actual damages, except as may be required by statute. Each party shall bear its own costs and expenses and an equal share of the arbitrators' and administrative fees of arbitration. Except as may be required by law, neither a party nor an arbitrator may disclose the existence, content, or results of any arbitration hereunder without the prior written consent of both parties.

El Central Real Collection

With a focus on classic notes of Central and South America, with miscellaneous notes from around the world, World Banknote Auctions presents this catalog "El Central Real Collection of World Banknotes". Nearly 400 lots are offered in this sale, which takes place on December 13.

The highlight of this sale is a strong selection of banknotes from Mexico, including a substantial number of specimens and proofs originally from the archives of the American Banknote Company. While many of these notes are extremely rare in issued form, specimens provide a more affordable alternative. Although, many are quite scarce and have precious few auction appearances.

The El Central Real collection focuses on collectable notes in collector grades. Of particular interest is a nice group of notes from the 1879 series of Peru, including the scarce 500 Soles, which is seldom offered for sale. Popular modern type notes in high grades from countries such as the Netherlands and Singapore are also offered. While the collection does not feature any great rarities, the depth and scope of the collection assures that there is something for every dedicated collection of world paper money.

To appeal to an international audience, part of this catalog is in Spanish in addition to the English text. Please note, because this sale has a printed catalog there is a buyer's premium of 20% (\$10 minimum). Our standard flat-rate shipping rates of \$15 within the United States and \$30 everywhere else applies to this sale. We hope this catalog will provide an incentive for everyone interested to take a closer look at the fascinating world of paper money and all it has to offer.



Our auctions take place exclusively on our website, www.worldbanknoteauctions.com and on our Mobile Apps, available in the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. Before the auction, register with a valid credit card (used for verification purposes only) and place bids in advance of the sale or during the live auction. All front scans are displayed in this catalog; for back scans please see our website.

During the live auction we sell approximately 100-120 lots per hour, but it is not unusual to sell lots at a faster or slower rate.

All lots are subject to 20% buyer's premium with a \$10 minimum per lot. If you are successful in the sale you will receive an invoice in your email inbox which includes buyer's premium, shipping and sales tax (applicable only when shipped to an address in the State of California). 
This 1883 series was prepared by American Banknote Company and specimens were printed, but this type was never issued for circulation. The Bauman catalog lists this as R-7, meaning 1 to 5 pieces known. We have not been able to locate any recent auction results for this note in any form. At first glance this may appear to be a remainder, but on the back it appears to include a printer’s annotation, which might make it a specimen as PCGS suggests. Regardless, an important opportunity for the Argentinean specialist. PCGS mentions “Edge damage; minor writing in ink”.



PCGS mentions "Minor foreign substance".



Banknotes of Mexico in the El Central Real Collection

The banknotes of the Republic of Mexico provide a fascinating look into the country's rich history. Mexico was one of the early adopters of paper money and it was first introduced 1813. Towards the end of the 19th century, many local banks ordered and issued a wide variety of banknotes at the American Banknote Company, headquartered in New York. These notes, which this collection contains a wide variety of, are some of the most beautiful banknotes ever produced.

The El Central Real Collection offers notes from several regions of Mexico, many of which have been certified in high grades. Yet, despite their broad appeal and scarcity many remain relatively affordable. Many of these notes were extremely rare and seldom seen prior to the sale of the American Banknote Company archives in the early 1990s. This sale gave collectors an opportunity to add specimens to their collection of notes that were widely seen in Mexican commerce around the turn of the century. If it wasn't for the sale of these archives, collectors would never be able to acquire many of these notes. A collection of this size and scope remains seldom offered.

The Mexican notes offered in the following lots are sorted, like the rest of the catalog, by Pick number. To aid the Mexican specialist, each listing also contains an M number, which refers to Mexican Paper Money, 2010 Edition. This leading reference work on the banknotes of Mexico contains tons of information and is a valuable resource for anyone interested in these historic banknotes.

Pero, aunque su amplia apelación y escasez, muchas siguen siendo relativamente asequibles. Muchos de estos billetes eran extremadamente poco comunes y poco vistas previo a la venta de la American Banknote Company archivos en los primeros años de los 1990s. Esta venta le dio a los coleccionistas una oportunidad para agregar muestras a sus colecciones de billetes que fueron ampliamente vistos en el comercio Mexicano alrededor del turno del siglo. Si no fuera por la venta de estos archivos coleccionistas nunca hubiera podido alquilar muchos de estos billetes. Una colección de este tamaño y alcance todavía sigue casi nunca ofrecida.

Para ayudar al especialista Mexicano, cada listado contiene un número de M, que refiere a Mexican Paper Money, 2010 Edition. 





When Middleton tried to exchange the notes in New Orleans it was noticed they were not signed, and the Secret Service was involved. It turned out that Middleton was not a representative for the bank at all, and that the entire order was fraudulent. Today, these NBNC counterfeits are highly collectible, and seldom come up for sale.
